RATIONALE AND STRUCTURE

Rationale

The CIVITAS cities have already gained a great deal of knowledge and experience in their projects. The Burgos Forum will be an excellent opportunity to share this knowledge with the whole CIVITAS community. Without doubt cities power economic growth. But an expanding economy is accompanied by increased traffic. We all know the results: congestion, pollution, and decreasing quality of life. What all cities throughout Europe have in common is the need of fast and practical solutions. CIVITAS can provide an appropriate European network. Participating in this year's Forum "**Cities in Motion: Towards a New Role for Cities in European Transport Policy**" means a chance to obtain a great deal of information about measures and solutions in other cities, as well as exchange ideas and learn from each other. One thing is certain: transport policy is no longer a mere item on the agenda: it has to be lived!

To ensure intensive knowledge transfer among all CIVITAS Forum participants, eight workshops and nine roundtables have been planned.

Workshops: 2-3 presentations per workshop will be prepared by invited speakers. These presentations will form the basis for questions and a discussion. The number of participants per workshop is not limited. Interpretation will be available in several language (please check the official programme for more details).

Roundtables: A moderator will give an opening presentation to kick off an interactive debate with well-prepared participants. In order to ensure a coherent information flow and lively discussion only 10-15 participants will be able to attend each roundtable. Preliminary registration on CIVITAS web site is obligatory, participation is on a first come first served basis. English will be the working language of every roundtable.

FROM MADRID TO BURGOS BY BUS

On the 25th September 2006 four CIVITAS buses have been arranged to bring participants from Madrid (Barajas) Airport to Burgos. Two CIVITAS buses will leave at 12.00 and two will leave at 16.00.

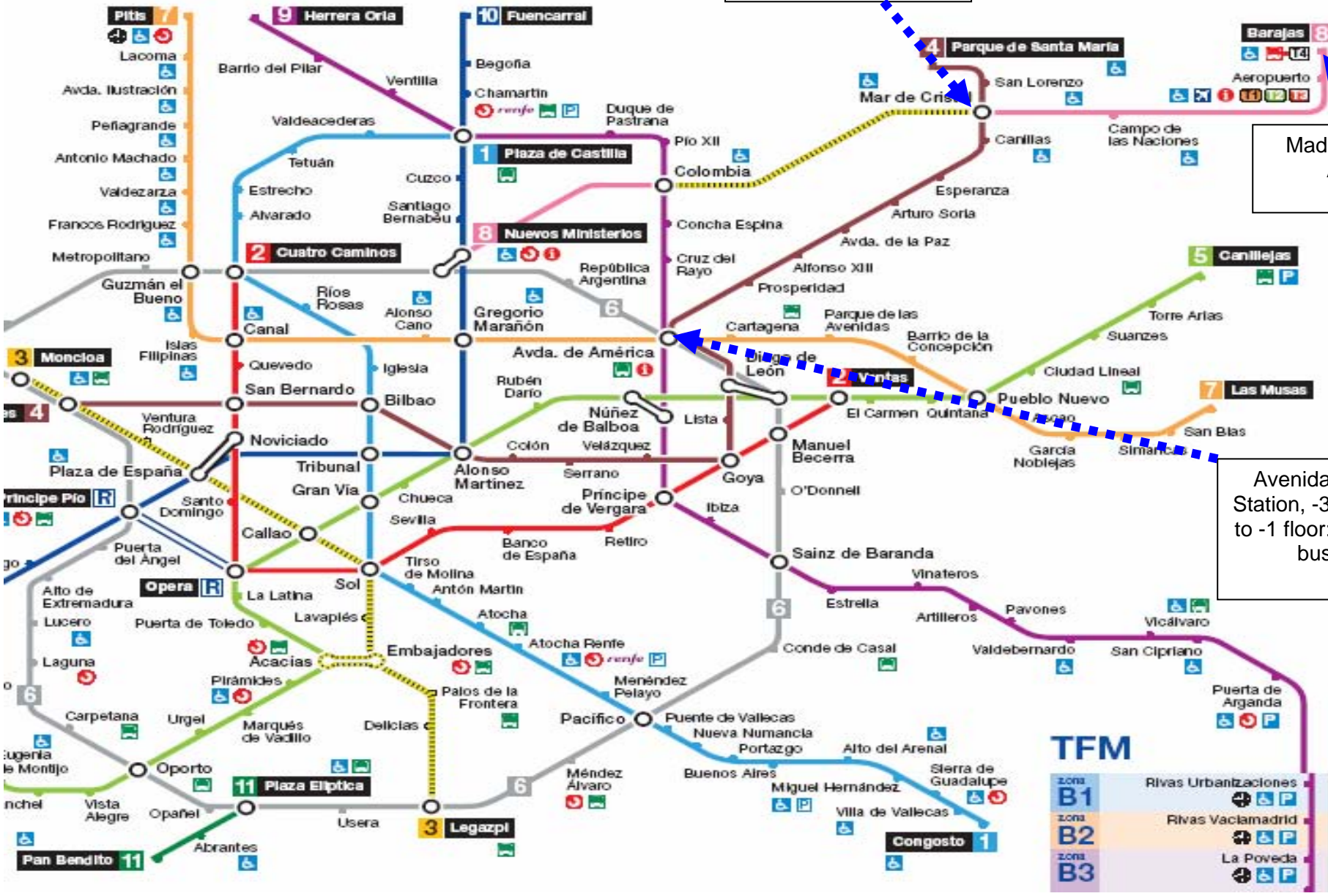

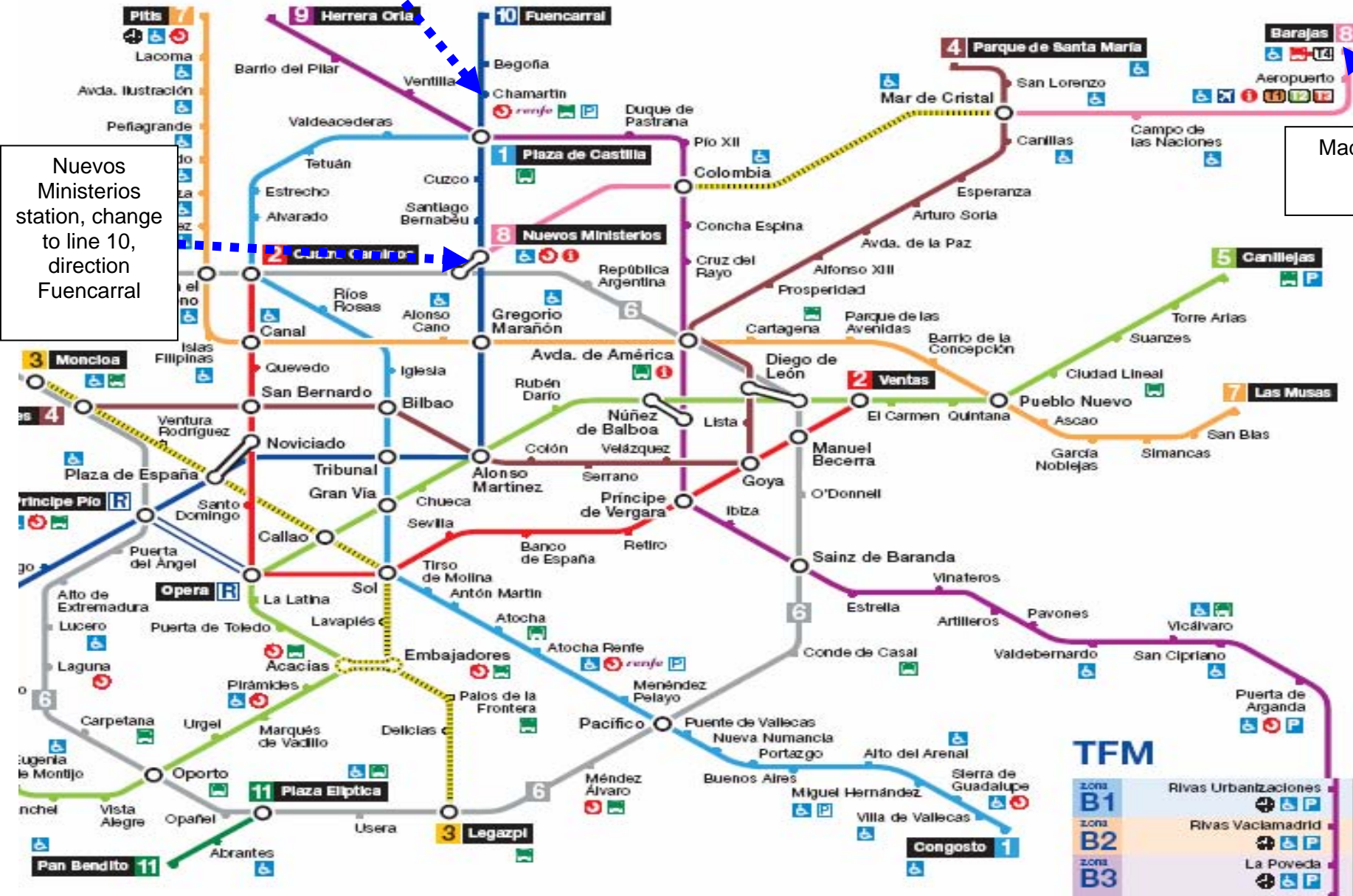
